Dear Mr. Shreves:

Imperial Irrigation District's 1992-1993 Water Savings Test Program

Your letter of April 14, 1992 inquired:

- "1. If IID undertakes a program to produce wet water that MWD can use or bank and such is approved by PVID, CVWD and the Bureau, will MWD fund the program in 1992 and 1993?
 - 2. If MWD's answer to the first question is yes, how much is MWD willing to pay to fund the program and have the water made available to it?"

In answer to question one, Metropolitan is interested in moving forward with this type of program. However, we see that there are a number of issues that must necessarily be addressed before the program could be implemented. These issues include the following:

- a. The specifics of the program need to be defined to assure that "wet" water is being produced. The mechanism for determining the yield of the program must be determined to be assured that the water is not simply unused agricultural water or created out of additional conservation activities which are required of Imperial.
- b. Since Coachella Valley Water District has already openly indicated that they would reject developing such a program in Imperial, any such initial draft principles should be forwarded to them for their concurrence before moving forward.
- c. The Palo Verde Irrigation District Land Fallowing Program is developed as a test and it would be best

to have the preliminary results from that program before preceding with a more ambitious program in other districts. In addition, Arizona and Nevada have already indicated that they are concerned over the storage provisions under the PVID type agreement, even though they would not be harmed by such storage. Any enlargement of those storage rights, even though they have been identified as nonprecedent in the PVID type agreement, could further heighten those states concerns and interfere with the implementation of that program as well.

d. A time schedule should be prepared demonstrating the necessary steps and approvals that would be required for implementation.

In answer to your question number two, I cannot provide you with a dollar amount without knowing the specifics of the program and how it fits into the overall concurrence of the parties and the rights that we may have to such water. Necessarily, the issues addressed in answer to question number one must first be developed and the price negotiated.

I will be happy to discuss the above issues with you and work as expeditiously as possible towards addressing these items.
