Authorize replacement standby generator and transformer and final design of generator station at Eagle Mountain Pumping Plant.

Appropriate \$875,000; and authorize (1) procurement of replacement standby generator and transformer; and (2) final design of the generator station at the Eagle Mountain Pumping Plant (Approp. 15438). (E&CP)

Option #1:

Adopt the CEQA determination and

- a. Appropriate \$875,000; and
- b. Authorize final design and equipment procurement to replace the standby generator at Eagle Mountain Pumping Plant.
- 7-3 Authorize final design of two reliability projects at Mills plant.

 Appropriate \$620,000; and authorize final design of two reliability projects at the Mills plant (Approp. 15452). (E&CP)

Option #1:

Adopt the CEQA determination and

- a. Appropriate \$620,000 in budgeted funds;
- b. Authorize final design to refurbish the weir gates and filter inlet valves at Mills Modules Nos. 3 and 4; and
- c. Authorize final design of Mills Electrical Buildings Nos. 1 and 2 seismic upgrades.

8-1 Approve Metropolitan's Annual Statement of Investment Policy and delegation of authority.

Approve Metropolitan's annual Statement of Investment Policy and delegation of authority to the Treasurer to make investments on behalf of Metropolitan. (B&F)

Recommendation:

Adopt the CEQA determination and

- a. Approve staff's recommendation to adopt the Statement of Investment Policy; and
- b. Delegate authority to invest to the Treasurer.

8-2 Award contract and authorize final design to upgrade fault current protection at CRA pumping plant switch houses.

Appropriate \$2.4 million; award \$1,245,405 procurement contract to OneSource Distributors; and authorize final design to upgrade the fault current protection at the Colorado River Aqueduct pumping plant switch houses (Approp. 15438). (E&CP)

Recommendation:

Option #1:

Adopt the CEQA determination and

- a. Appropriate \$2.4 million;
- b. Authorize final design of fault current protection upgrades for the five CRA pumping plant switch houses; and
- c. Award \$1,245,405 procurement contract to OneSource Distributors for current-limiting line reactors.

8-3 Authorize capital program for projects costing less than \$250,000. Appropriate \$4.15 million; and authorize capital program for projects costing less than \$250,000 for fiscal year 2009/10 (Approp. 15460). (E&CP)

- c. Designate the General Manager as the decision-making body for purposes of reviewing, approving, and certifying any environmental documentation that may be required for such projects.

8-4 <u>Authorize Metropolitan force construction of three water quality and reliability projects at Skinner plant.</u>

Appropriate \$3.36 million; and authorize Metropolitan force construction of three water quality and reliability projects at the Skinner plant (Approps. 15447, 15365, and 15435). (E&CP)

Adopt the CEQA determination and

- a. Appropriate \$3.36 million in budgeted funds;
- b. Authorize final design, procurement and construction of a chlorination system to control quagga mussel growth by the Skinner ORP open cooling water loop;
- c. Authorize construction of the Skinner Modules Nos. 5 and 6 filter surface wash piping rehabilitation project; and
- d. Authorize final design, procurement and construction of a common chlorine injection point for Skinner Plants Nos. 2 and 3.
- Authorize purchase of nitrogen oxide emission reduction credits for standby generators at Diemer and Weymouth plants.

- a. Authorize the purchase NOx emission reduction credits for the Diemer standby generators for an amount not to exceed \$900,000; and
- b. Authorize the purchase of NOx emission reduction credits for the Weymouth standby generators for an amount not to exceed \$800,000.
- Authorize payment for participation in State Water Contractors, Inc.

Authorize (1) expenditure of \$24 million to fund additional FY 2008/09 needs for Metropolitan's Conservation Credits Program; (2) contract amendment with Honeywell International increasing maximum amount payable by \$22 million to \$80 million; and (3) other near-term program changes. (WP&S)

Recommendation:

Option #1:

Adopt the CEQA determination and authorize staff to:

- a. Transfer \$24 million to the Water Stewardship Fund to pay additional fiscal year 2008/09 needs for Metropolitan's Conservation Credits Program;
- b. Amend Honeywell International agreement increasing the maximum amount payable by \$22 million to \$80 million;
- c. Implement CCP in fiscal year 2009/10 as described; and
- d. Implement program changes as described, including modification of incentives as identified in Attachment 3 to the board letter.

Adopt the CEQA determination and approve up to \$1.14 million to renew or replace the Aircraft Liability, Crime, Excess General Liability policies (retaining the \$25 million retention) and Excess Workers' Compensation policy (retaining the \$5 million self-insured retention and \$25 million policy limit).

Adopt the CEQA determination and authorize General Manager to:

- a. Use up to \$4.5 million from Metropolitan's Category III non-flow environmental improvement account to assist in completion of an environmental documentation and preliminary engineering for the Two-Gates Fish Protection Demonstration Project with the understanding that CALFED is still reviewing whether to credit the use of these funds against Metropolitan's future Delta environmental obligations; and
- b. Increase the maximum amount payable under three professional service contracts with consultants Entrix, Moffatt & Nichol, and Resource Management Associates to \$500,000 per year each to assist in completion of the environmental documentation, hydrodynamic modeling, biological field surveys, and preliminary engineering for the Two-Gates Fish Protection Demonstration Project.
