# Criteria for Evaluating Delta Legislation

  - Delta Policy Principles (April 2006)
  - Delta Action Plan (June 2007)
  - Criteria for Conveyance Options (September 2007)
  - Delta Governance
  - Delta and Statewide Infrastructure Financing
  - Water-Use Efficiency Policy Principles

# Delta Legislation – Emerging Issues

- Co-Equal Goals: Reliable Water Supply/Ecosystem Restoration
  - How are goals defined?
  - Are goals balanced?
  - Will legislation require reduced dependence on Delta diversions – for exporters and/or throughout the watershed?
- Delta Stewardship Council
  - Delta Vision Recommendation: appointees by Governor; no geographic requirements to reflect statewide significance of Delta
  - Legislative versus gubernatorial appointees?
  - Length of terms for appointees?
  - Authority and responsibilities?

- Approval of Conveyance
  - Will legislation create role for new Delta Stewardship Council?
  - Options: Certification of BDCP EIR/EIS by Council; inclusion of BDCP in Delta Plan; approval of new conveyance by Council
  - Will legislation assign operation of future conveyance to new entity?
- Bay Delta Conservation Plan
  - What is BDCP's role in new Delta Plan?
  - What is Delta Stewardship Council's role in reviewing/approving BDCP?
  - Are there new conditions/requirements for approval?
  - Is NCCPA discretionary or mandatory?

- Federal Participation Options
  - How are federal BDCP-implementing agencies integrated into Delta Plan?
  - Will legislation require Coastal Zone Management Act (e.g. California Coastal Commission approach) for federal action consistency with state Delta plan?
  - Will legislation embrace alternate approach integration through cooperative agreements/contracts between federal/state governments?
- Area of Origin Protections
  - Will legislation reinforce or expand county and watershed of origin protections?
- Geographic Scope of Delta Plan/Habitat Actions
  - Legal Delta?
  - Tributaries? Above/below dam?

- Delta Conservancy
  - Number of local appointees?
  - Scope of work: habitat restoration, agriculture preservation, economic development
  - Role in implementing BDCP?

- Role of State Water Resources Control Board
  - Will legislation deviate from SWRCB's Delta Strategic Plan?
  - Isolated facility permit conditions for approval for change of diversion?
  - Instream flow requirements for Delta and some/all tributaries?
    - Timing of review?
    - What are goals for any new flow objectives and are goals balanced with consumptive needs?
    - Responsibility for flow requirements?
    - Who pays for any review process?

- Independent Science
  - Will Cal-Fed Independent Science Panel be replaced?
  - Who would appoint new Science Panel?
  - How would new Science Panel be integrated into Delta Plan, Delta Stewardship Council, BDCP?
- Delta Protection Commission
  - Will legislation amend land use decision-making in Delta primary zone under existing Delta Protection Act?
- Early Action Mandates?
  - Implement short-term habitat improvements
  - Study separation of State Water Project from DWR
  - Interim instream flow mandates
  - Test 2-Gates Project and fish screens at Clifton Court
  - Develop financing strategy for implementing Delta Plan

- Finance Questions
  - Start-up costs for Delta Council and Delta Conservancy
  - Fee proposals beneficiaries pay approach; targeted fees on specific water users; or fees on other uses within Delta watershed
  - Funding mechanisms for water bond public goods surcharge, diversion fee and/or general fund

#### Water Use Efficiency

- Requires 20% reduction in statewide urban per capita water use by 2020 (10% by 2015)
- Provides three pathways for compliance to maximize local flexibility
- May require minimum efficiency requirement from all retailers
- Provides credit for use of recycled water
- Acknowledges past investments in water conservation
- Requires agricultural water suppliers over defined acreage threshold to prepare agricultural water management plans
- Agricultural water suppliers to implement water management practices already required for CVP contractors
- Compliance for urban and agricultural water suppliers precondition for receiving state water management grants and loans
