Subject

History of selection of Board Vice Chairs and history of Executive Committee membership

Description

At its meeting on May 25, 2010, the Executive Committee requested the history of the selection of the Vice Chairs of the Board of Directors and the history of the membership of the Executive Committee. The history presented for both the Vice Chairs and the Executive Committee begins on July 19, 1976 when the Board adopted recommendations of the Ad Hoc Committee to Study Committee Functions on Proposed Changes set forth in the document entitled "Organization and Procedures of the Board of Directors" dated July 2, 1976.

The July 1976 action established three Vice Chair positions that were to provide, insofar as practical, adequate regional representation for the benefit of the entire Metroplitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan). Each of the three Vice Chairs had equal status and was elected by the Board, after nomination by the Special Nominating Committee, to serve a two-year term. A Director was limited to serving two successive full two-year terms as Vice Chair.

In November 1992 a fourth Vice Chair position was added, with two Vice Chairs elected in even years and two elected in odd years. Each Vice Chair was to be a communicator for a specified region of Metropolitan.

In December 1994 a fifth Vice Chair position was added, and the selection for Directors for the Vice Chair position was now to be made without regard to the regions represented. The Vice Chairs were directed to act in the Chair's absence and were elected by the Board to serve two-year terms.

In June 1999 the number of Vice Chair positions was reduced to one position appointed by the Chair to serve at the Chair's pleasure, with an existing position of Vice Chair with an unexpired office as of January 1, 1999 to remain in office until the expiration of that term at the end of that year. The Chair was to assign one or more specified duties, in addition to serving in the Chair's absence, to the Vice Chairs.

At the December 1999 board meeting, it was determined that both of the current Vice Chairs were needed, and two Vice Chair positions were authorized, both selected by the Chair and serving at the Chair's pleasure. The Vice Chairs gained ex officio membership on standing and special committees in February 2000.

The current authorization of four Vice Chairs selected by the Chair, with the approval of the Executive Committee and the Board, serving at the Chair's pleasure was instituted by Administrative Code changes approved by the Board in January 2005. The selections for the Vice Chair positions are made without regard to represented regions; each Vice Chair can act in the Chair's absence, failure or inability to act; each is assigned duties by the Chair; and each has ex officio members on standing or special committees as set forth in the Administrative Code.

With regard to membership on the Executive Committee, the July 19, 1976 board action established membership on the committee as the Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary of the Board and six additional nonofficer members elected by the Board. The nonofficer members were nominated by a Special Committee selected for this purpose or from the floor and served contemporaneously with the elected officers. The immediate past Chair of the Board was added to the committee, and it was provided that three of the nonofficer members were to be elected in even years and three in odd years, in March 1978. In November 1979, a provision was added to ensure that the elected members of the committee did not exceed two full consecutive terms in office.

An action in September 1980 confirmed the existing composition of the Executive Committee, and that the nonofficer members served two-year terms commencing on January 1 of the year immediately following their election.

In September 1982 the Chairs of the standing committees became ex offcio members of the Executive Committee, and in November 1988 all past Chairs that were still on Metropolitan's Board became ex officio members of the Executive Committee.

A June 1999 action of the Board, that became permanent in November 1999, added two nonofficer members appointed by the Chair to the Executive Committee, bringing the number of nonofficer members to eight.

The chairs of the Subcommittee on Rules and Ethics and the Audit Subcommittee were added to the Executive Committee in January 2002 and eliminated from membership in January 2005.

A June 2006 action eliminated the two nonofficer members selected by the Chair. Changes to the Administrative Code approved in February 2007 eliminated all nonofficer members of the Executive Committee, creating the current composition of the Executive Committee as the Chair, Vice Chairs, Secretary of the Board, standing committee Chairs, and past Board Chairs who are Metropolitan Directors.

	Chair, Vice Chairs, Secretary, immediate past chair, six elected members, the chairs of the standing committees in addition to the Executive Committee, as ex officio members.
July 13, 1982	Modified terms of the six elected members of the Executive Committee to restore balance of three being elected in even years and three being elected in odd years. The elections had become unbalanced with four up for election in 1982 and two up for election in 1983.
September 29, 1980	Established Composition of Executive Committee as: Chair, Vice Chairs, Secretary, immediate past Chair, and six additional directors nominated by the Special Nominating Committee or from the floor, for two-year terms, with three elected in even years and three elected in odd years, with terms commencing on January 1 of the year immediately following their election.
November 1, 1979	Provision added to ensure that the elected members of the Executive Committee do not exceed two full consecutive terms in office.
March 14, 1978	Added the immediate past Chair of the Board to the Executive Committee and provided that with regard to the six elected members, three are to be elected in even years and three are to be elected in odd years. Nominations are to be made at the December meeting of the Board in advance of the new term of office, and within 90 days of a vacancy that occurs in this office
July 19, 1976	Adopted Recommendations of Ad Hoc Committee to Study Standing Committee Functions on Proposed Changes in "Organization and Procedures of the Board of Directors", dated July 2, 1976 for the following Composition of the Executive Committee: Chair, Vice Chairs, Secretary, six additional elected members nominated by a Special Committee selected for the purpose, or from the floor (also referred to as "nonofficer members"), to serve contemporaneously with the elected officers. A member of the Executive Committee shall not serve as the Chair of any Standing Committee, but this restriction shall not apply to any interim, temporary or subcommittee appointed from time to time to resolve current problems or to meet special conditions.
