Amanda Beck of First Solar expressed her appreciation to Metropolitan's staff in being supportive of their 550 megawatt photovoltaic solar farm project. She stated if item 8-3, authorize entering into a long-term agreement with Desert Sunlight for future power line crossings, was approved today, it would give First Solar a license to use Metropolitanowned land for this project. She indicated the proposed project would produce enough power to provide clean, green renewable energy for 160,000 California homes.

Ralph Nunez of the city of Riverside spoke in regard to item 8-2, consider offer for the purchase of Metropolitan's 83.6-acre Box Springs Feeder right-of-way. He stated the city and county of Riverside are very interested in acquiring this property due to its recreational value.

Jane Block of Riverside Land Conservancy also spoke in regard to item 8-2. She stated the Box Springs feeder has support from the city and county of Riverside. She thanked

the Board members for their past actions in Riverside benefitting the environment and the recreation with the Santa Rosa Plateau and the Diamond Valley Lake recreational area.
