FORM 700 FILINGS

The economic disclosure (Form 700) filing season is winding down. Annual 2015 filings were due **April 1.** 2016.

New employees and directors who filed assuming office statements on or after October 1, 2015 are not required to file annual statements until 2017. As with last year, filers had a choice of filing electronically or manually.

The Ethics Office assisted with 48 calls and emailed questions related to the logistics of completing and submitting disclosure forms during this filing period. Among the directors, 92% submitted before the deadline, while 96% of designated employees met the April 1st requirement.



PROJECTS & INITIATIVES

The Ethics Officer and staff remain engaged in several projects and initiatives for review, analysis, and evaluation of various aspects of Metropolitan's activities:

- Use of the new electronic matter management and document management software solution.
- Amendments to Metropolitan's conflict of interest code (i.e., designated positions and disclosure categories).
- Monthly director conflict bulletins.
- Joint analysis with General Counsel's Office and External Affairs on gift reporting and limits relative to participant expenses on Metropolitan inspection trips and conflict of interest questions related to the budget and rate setting process.

ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE

The Ethics Office provides advice, counseling, or other assistance to any director, officer, employee, or contractor regarding application or interpretation of Metropolitan's ethics rules or policies. Absent any unusual circumstances, the Office gives its advice in writing.

The Ethics Office can provide advice only prospectively, i.e., about future activities. If it becomes apparent that a request for advice or other assistance concerns events that have already occurred, it might be necessary to review the matter as a potential violation.

In March 2016, the Office provided analysis and advice in the following areas:

- ⇒ Concurrent outside employment.
- ⇒ Political campaign contributions.
- ⇒ Disclosure of stock investment interests.
- ⇒ Rental property income disclosure.
- ⇒ Recusal due to spouse's ownership interest & income.
