Current Action

Adopt CEQA Determination

Approve the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies

Background

The California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) requires FEMA applicants to submit a new Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution every 3 years or whenever there is a change of the Authorized Agents.

The Resolution identifies three agents for Metropolitan that can sign official correspondence and receive FEMA reimbursement payments

The last Resolution was updated in 2013

Federal and State Disaster Assistance

- Disaster assistance becomes available when a disaster has been declared by the Governor or the President
- As an agency that provides a vital service, Metropolitan is eligible for disaster assistance for repairing disaster related damage in its service area.

Over the past 20 years, Metropolitan has received about \$12.8 million in reimbursement for disaster related damage repairs

Examples of Past Reimbursable Events

Fire Storms of 2007 & 2008

Freeway Complex Fire, Sayre Fire, Rice Wildfire
Total damage reimbursement: \$1.2 Million

OC-71 Service Connection Structure - 2007

Fiber Optic Cable at Diemer - 2008





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Rain Storms of 2010

- Severe flood damage in Orange, Riverside and San Diego Counties
- Total reimbursement \$800,000
- Repair of eroded patrol roads
