Background

Safe, Clean Water Program Proposed Funding Measure

- May 30, 2017
 - Supervisors directed LA County Flood Control District to develop a plan
- November 2017 June 2018
 - Invited stakeholder input
- July 17, 2018
 - Public hearing
 - Decision to place parcel tax on November 2018 ballot

Program Purpose

- Funding to implement stormwater and urban runoff projects that
 - Improve water quality
 - Increase water supply
 - Provide community investment benefit
- Projects must provide water quality benefits with one or both of the remaining benefits
- Prioritize projects that assist in achieving compliance with NPDES Waste Discharge Requirements for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Discharges

Special Parcel Tax

Proposed Tax Calculation

- Based on impermeable area
 - 2.5 cents per square foot
 - Area based off vegetation infrared imagery and aerial photography
- Target \$300 M per year
- Tax rate remain the same unless changed by ordinance
 - Tax rate cannot be increased by ordinance
- After 30 years:
 - Board of Supervisors evaluate needs of program and make affirmative determination for continuation
 - If determined to have no need for additional projects, Special Parcel Tax may be reduced to fund operation, maintenance and replacement

Appeals, Exemptions and Credits

- Exemptions
 - Government and non-profit organization owned or leased parcels
 - Low income seniors upon application and approval
- Credits
 - Up to 100% credit for parcels, or portion of a parcel, that infiltrate all wet and dry weather runoff onsite
- Detailed procedures and guidelines for appeal, credit calculations and verifications under development

Expenditure Plan

Allocation of Tax Revenue

- AB 1180
 - Chaptered October 2017
 - Effective January 1, 2018

Safe, Clean Water Program, by Funding Allocation

- Regional Program: 50% of revenues shall be for watershed-based regional projects and programs
- Municipal Program: 40% of revenues shall be for municipal projects and programs in cities and unincorporated areas in the Flood Control District (FCD)
- FCD Program: 10% of revenues shall be for FCD projects and program, and overall administration

Municipal Program (40% of total)

- Funds allocated proportionally to the revenue generated with each municipality or County unincorporated areas, except for disadvantaged communities
- Up to 30% annually can be used for O & M

Municipal Program

- All projects must be multibenefit and include, at a minimum, a <u>water quality</u> benefit
- <u>Exception</u> to multibenefit requirement may be made for single-purpose water quality projects




Regional Program (50% of total)

Regional Program

- All projects must be watershed-based (per statute)
- Both centralized and distributed projects will be funded
- All projects must be multibenefit



Allocation of Regional Program Funds



- Infrastructure (85%)
- Technical Resources (10%)
- Scientific Studies (5%)

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Nine Watershed Areas (Regions)



Definition for Disadvantaged Communities

- Disadvantaged Communities (DAC) Census Block Group with an annual median household income of less than 80% of the statewide annual median household income (Water Code section 79505.5)
- DAC Benefit water quality, water supply, and/or community investment benefit located in a DAC or providing direct benefit to a DAC population

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Expenditure for Disadvantaged Communities

- Disadvantaged communities (DAC) will receive a greater amount than was collected
- Municipal Program
 - Funding not less than 110% of tax revenue collected
- Regional Program
 - Projects that provide DAC benefits should be not less than 110% of the ratio of the DAC population to the total population in each Watershed Area

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Program Timeline

Program Timeline

- Estimated tax tool calculator available on website www.safecleanwaterla.org
- November 6, 2018
 - Two-thirds majority required
- If approved, ad valorem property tax collection beginning FY 2019-20
- First installment of tax available beginning 2020

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
