Two Program Elements

Potable Reuse Funding The Water Research Foundation

- 7 potable reuse studies
- \$975,000
- Managed by WRF
- Agreement executed in July

Member Agency Studies

- Request for Proposals
- \$3.5 million
- Max \$500k per agency and per study
- 2 year studies

Request for Proposals

- July 6: RFP sent to member agencies
- July 26: Webinar with 35 participants
- Communications
 - Dedicated website and e-mail
- August 31: RFP closed

Two Proposals Not Recommended

- Low ratings from panel
- Did not achieve program criteria
 - Site-specific
 - Not new or innovative
 - Unclear work plan

Additional Funding Considerations

- Agencies submitting more than \$500,000
 - Partially fund one proposal
- In-kind services
 - Not allowed for member agency match funds
 - Panel identified potential in-kind services in some proposals
 - Staff may reduce funding amount during agreement negotiations

Next Steps

Receive Committee feedback

- Implement funding agreements with ten recommended proposals under \$250,000
- Bring five recommended proposals over \$250,000 to the Board for consideration in January
- Provide updates to the Board as studies progress
- Hold a regional symposium to share results when studies are complete
