Proposed Stormwater Pilots

DIRECT USE PILOT



- Capture on-site
- Non-potable uses
- Cisterns





Centralized

- Capture from drainage system
- Replenish groundwater basins
- Spreading basins



Distributed

- Capture on-site
- Replenish groundwater basins
- Green streets

Pilot Program Purpose

Provide incentives to encourage development of stormwater projects



Collect data and evaluate water supply benefit



Evaluate participation







Pilot Program Elements

Proposed Budget

- \$5 million
- Maximum of \$500,000/project



Proposed Duration

- Anticipated start: September 2019
- Application period: up to 2 years
- Construction and monitoring: 5 years

Participation

- Public/private sites (non-residential)
- Outreach
 - Member Agency Managers' (MAM) Meeting
 - Informational webinar



Administration & Funding

- Three-party agreement
- Payment
 - Through member agency
 - Directly to customer
- Reporting







Monitoring & Reporting

- Collect three years of monitoring data
- Submit three reports
 - Due at fiscal year-end

Proposed Pilot Program Criteria

- Project must:
 - Have an estimated minimum capture and reuse of 1 acre-foot per year
 - Include metering/measurement of capture and reuse
 - Offset potable water use
 - Not be already under construction*
 - Be within Metropolitan's service area

*Existing and projects under construction may be eligible for monitoring component and consideration on a case-by-case basis







Proposed Pilot Program Incentive

Construction

Up to 50% (1:1 match) of eligible project costs (e.g. construction, metering, etc.)

+


Monitoring & Reporting

\$20,000/report (total of 3 reports)

Capped at \$500,000/project
