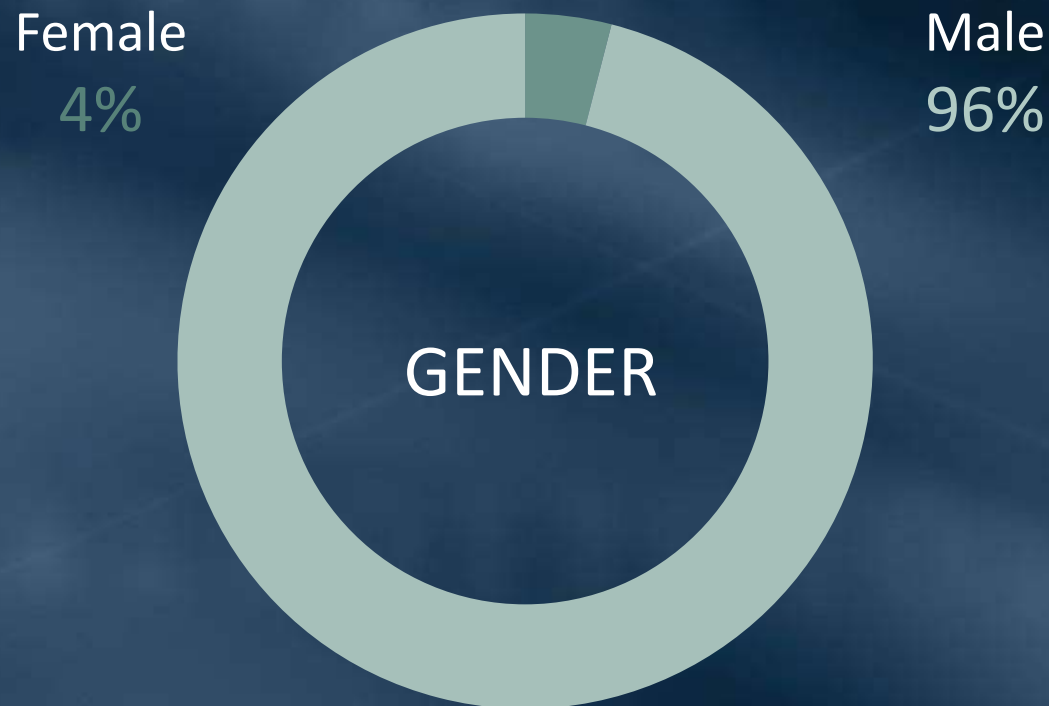

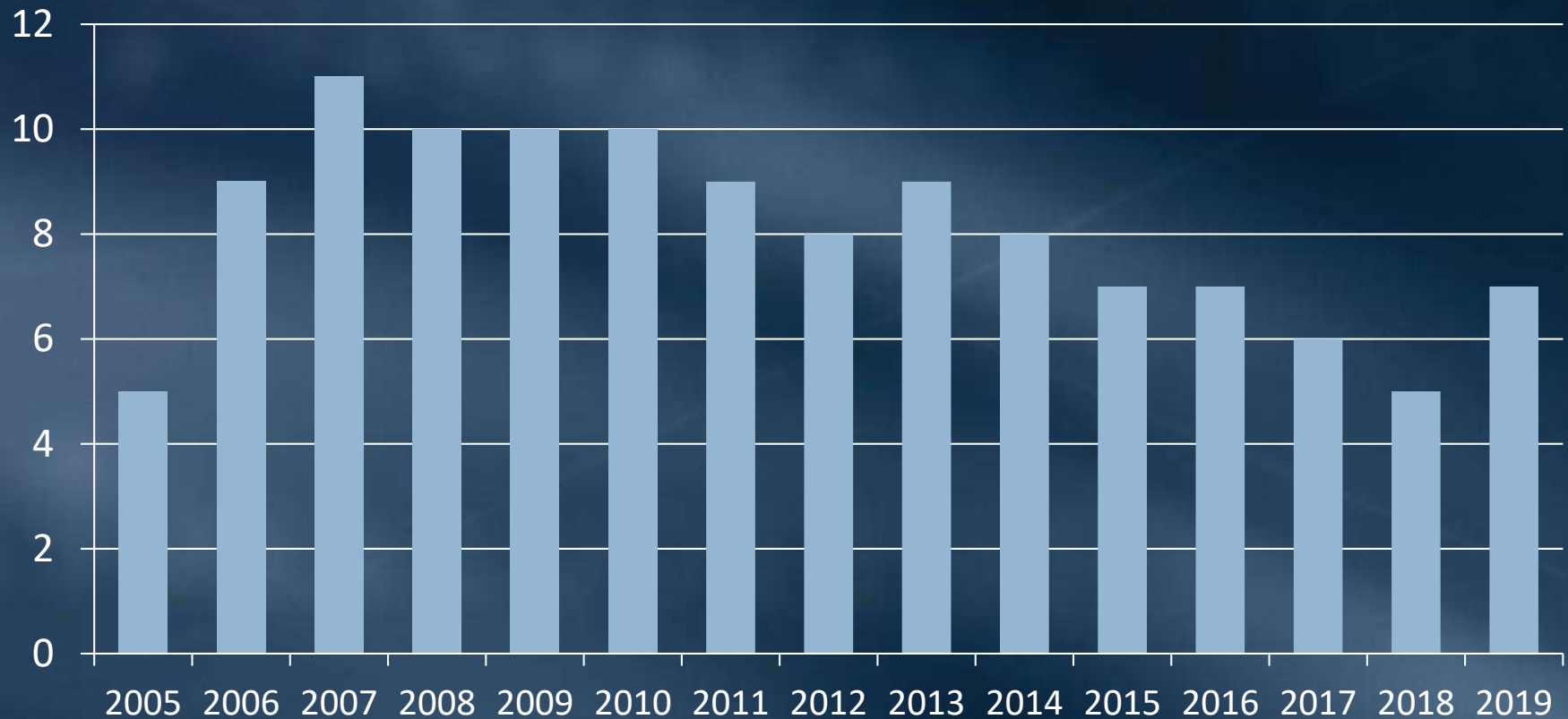

 - Journey trade positions e.g., Electricians, Coaters, Heavy Equipment Operators, Lineman, Mechanics, Pump Plant Specialist and Water Treatment Plant Operator
- Service-Maintenance EEO4 Category
 - Maintenance and journey helper positions, e.g., Apprentice, Maintenance Assistants, Commercial Truck Driver, Electricians, Mechanics, Coaters
