

Metropolitan Cases

Cora Constructors, Inc. v. Metropolitan (San Bernardino Superior Court)

On October 15, 2014, Cora Constructors, Inc. (Cora) filed a cross-complaint against Metropolitan, alleging breach of contract and seeking \$1.8 million plus interest in damages. The crosscomplaint involved work that Cora performed on Metropolitan's Copper Basin Reservoir Outlet Structure Rehabilitation Project, and was precipitated by a complaint against Cora by its electrical subcontractor, Davis Electric, Inc. Specifically, Cora alleged that it had incurred significant overhead costs due to Metropolitancaused delays, was not paid for extra work, and was wrongfully assessed \$480,000 in liquidated damages. As a result of cross-complaints filed by Cora against several of its subcontractors, the case involved numerous parties. Following roughly one year and four months of discovery and prior to the scheduled June 27, 2016 trial date, the parties participated in a one-day mediation on March 11. Shortly after mediation, the parties reached a global settlement. Pursuant to the settlement, Metropolitan agreed to return \$300,000 of the liquidated damages it had withheld due to the delay in the project completion date. The settling parties agreed to release all claims, dismiss all claims with prejudice, and to each bear their own fees and costs.

AFSCME Local 1902 v. Metropolitan (MOU Hearing Officer Appeal)

On March 22, 2016, Hearing Officer Robert Bergeson issued his decision denying a September 23, 2013, grievance by AFSCME Local 1902. The grievance alleged that Human Resources violated the AFSCME MOU and internal policy by failing to promote an employee to the classification of senior resource specialist as a result of the employee's job audit request. After hearing three days of testimony and receiving the parties' post-hearing briefs, Hearing Officer Bergeson determined that Human Resources properly maintained the employee at the classification of environmental specialist. The

Legal Department represented Metropolitan in this matter.

AFSCME Local 1902 v. Metropolitan (MOU Hearing Officer Appeal)

On March 28, 2016, Hearing Officer Kenneth A. Perea issued his decision denying a July 26, 2013, grievance by AFSCME Local 1902. The grievance alleged that Human Resources violated the AFSCME MOU and internal policy by failing to promote an employee to the classification of senior engineer as a result of the employee's job audit request. After hearing three days of testimony and receiving the parties' post-hearing briefs, Hearing Officer Perea determined that Human Resources properly maintained the employee at the classification of engineer. The Legal Department represented Metropolitan in this matter.

Bradley Nutt v. Metropolitan, et al. (Los Angeles County Superior Court)

As previously reported, Plaintiff Bradley Wayne Nutt, a former employee, filed a complaint on July 9, 2014, in Los Angeles County Superior Court against Metropolitan, which he amended on September 8, 2014. The complaints allege religious discrimination and retaliation in violation of the Fair Employment and Housing Act. Metropolitan is the sole defendant. As a remedy, Plaintiff seeks economic damages for past and future loss of earnings and benefits, general damages for emotional distress, and unspecified costs and statutory attorney's fees. Originally, this lawsuit was set for a three-week jury trial commencing on January 20, 2016. However, due to the trial court's unavailability and thereafter due to the withdrawal of Plaintiff's counsel, the trial date was moved and then taken off calendar. A trial setting conference took place on April 1, 2016, at which time new counsel appeared for Plaintiff. In response, the court scheduled the jury trial to begin on May 9, 2016.
